Course Objectives	The course "Postgraduate Thesis I" is the first part of the compulsory postgraduate thesis.				compulsory	
	The thesis is an important part of the education through which the student deepens the knowledge acquired in the postgraduate program by conducting some form of research under the supervision of a member of the program's teaching staff.  The course that accompanies the thesis is designed to provide basic knowledge and practice in the various aspects of the scientific research and thesis writing process. During the seminars of the course, students are given the opportunity, under the coordination of the course supervisors, to organize their research in a systematic way and to practice critical analysis by commenting constructively on the texts of their fellow students.					
	Participation in the seminars creates conditions for collective learning through critical interaction between students and between students and course leaders, preparing them better for the defense of the final project.					
	The DLADE206 course focuses on the selection and formulation of a limited scientific problem in the field of adult education, which must be theoretically and empirically substantiated using established methods of research and analysis in the social sciences.  During the course, emphasis is placed on identifying and formulating a relevant research problem. The definition and specification of the research topic is submitted at the end of the course for assessment in the form of a written assignment. The content of the assignment then forms the basis for the selection of an appropriate supervisor during the DLADE209 course where the thesis is expected to be completed.					
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	The paper submitted for examination at the end of the course "Postgraduate Thesis I" must contain a:  a) systematic and critical literature review, b) statement of the purpose and the main questions and, where appropriate, hypotheses of the work, as well as
