Course Objectives	<p>The thesis course is compulsory and consists of two parts - " Postgraduate Thesis I" and " Postgraduate Thesis II" - and lasts for two semesters.</p> <p>The thesis is an important part of the education through which the student deepens the knowledge acquired in the postgraduate programme by conducting some form of research under the supervision of a member of the programme's teaching staff.</p> <p>The course that accompanies the thesis is designed to provide basic knowledge and practice in the various aspects of the scientific research and thesis writing process. During the seminars of the course, students are given the opportunity, under the coordination of the course supervisors, to organise their research in a systematic way and to practise critical analysis by commenting constructively on the texts of their fellow students.</p> <p>Participation in the seminars (during the DLADE208 prerequisite course) creates conditions for collective learning through critical interaction between students and with the course leaders, preparing them for the defence of the final project in DLADE209.</p> <p>The course and the preparation of the project focuses on a limited scientific problem in the field of adult education, which must be theoretically and empirically documented using established methods of research and analysis in the social sciences.</p> <p>The DLADE208 course emphasizes the identification and formulation of a relevant research problem, which is delineated and specified during the course and submitted for evaluation at the end. The content of the written assignment constitutes the research proposal in a developed form and the basis of a supervisor's choice of a supervisor for the final dissertation in DLADE209.</p>
